



1. **Pratchett, Terry. The Colour of Magic.** Gerrards Cross: Colin Smythe, 1989.


Second printing, with a new Foreword. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony All the best". The book is firmly bound in lightly marked red cloth, lettered in metallic blue to the spine, the extremities are bumped. The text block is lightly marked and a little toned. The dust jacket is the original, correctly unpriced, with no barcode and the publisher's price label still present to the rear cover, it is lightly rubbed and creased to the edges, with possibly a little fading to the spine. Not quite so rare as the first edition which had a print run of only 506, but still uncommon with a fairly small print run of 1033 copies, and pleasing to find an inscribed example.


2. **Pratchett, Terry. Pyramids.** London: Victor Gollancz Ltd, 1989.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony May your camels be multiplied...", with a doodle of a pyramid forming part of the inscription and signature. The book is firmly bound in slightly bumped and marked black cloth, lettered in gilt to the spine. The text block is slightly age toned with a tea or coffee stain to the fore-edge, encroaching into a few pages. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is lightly marked with slight creasing and rubbing to the edges.

3. **Pratchett, Terry. Guards! Guards!** London: Victor Gollancz Ltd, 1989.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony! To Tony! Yet more wishes". The book is firmly bound in slightly marked and faded light blue cloth, lettered in metallic red to the spine, the extremities are bumped. The text block is a little age toned with some minor stains. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is a little marked, with minor rubbing and creasing at the edges.



London: Victor Gollancz Ltd, 1990.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett in black to the half title page: "To Tony All the best", also crossing through "Eric" in black. The book is firmly bound in slightly marked black cloth, lettered in gilt to the spine, which is cocked, the extremities are slightly bumped. The text block is lightly marked. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is slightly creased to the edges with a little fading to the spine.

5. **Pratchett, Terry. Moving Pictures.**

London: Victor Gollancz Ltd, 1990.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony Action!". The book is firmly bound in lightly marked and bumped black cloth, lettered in gilt to the spine. The text block is age toned and slightly sprung. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is lightly marked with minor creasing to the edges and slight fading to the spine.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony Boo!" with his Death stamp next to the inscription. The book is firmly bound in lightly marked and bumped red cloth, lettered in gilt to the spine. The text block is lightly toned with a few minor marks. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is a little rubbed and creased to the edges and the spine is slightly faded.

7. **Pratchett, Terry. Small Gods.**

London: Victor Gollancz, 1992.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "For Tony The Turtle MOVES!". The book is firmly bound in lightly marked and bumped brown cloth, lettered in gilt to the spine. The text block is a little toned with minor dusty marks. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is a little rubbed and creased to the edges with a few minor marks.

8. **Pratchett, Terry. Hogfather.**

London: Victor Gollancz, 1996.

Second impression. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony Happy Hogswatch..." with a little doodle of a scythe next to the signature. The book is firmly bound in somewhat marked and bumped black cloth, lettered in gilt to the spine. The text block is slightly toned with minor marks. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is lightly marked with minor rubbing and creasing to the edges.



9. Pratchett, Terry. **Jingo.**

London: Victor Gollancz, 1997.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony Buy Jingo! Oh, you have! Well done!", with a little doodle of a scythe next to the signature. The book showing the delightfully low quality of its original production, looking little if at all read, but the miniscule smear of glue holding the boards to the text block has given up, with the spine dropping entirely away and the front and rear endpapers lifting. Otherwise, it is bound in lightly marked and bumped black cloth, lettered in gilt to the spine. The text block is lightly toned. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is lightly rubbed and creased to the edges. A nicely inscribed example, albeit needing a minor repair, which any skilled binder could do in minutes, and which I'd attempt myself if I didn't have a bad track record with glue repairs...



The text block is slightly age toned with minor dusty marks. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is lightly rubbed and creased to the edges.





11. Pratchett, Terry. **Truckers, Diggers and Wings – The Nome Trilogy.**

London: Doubleday, 1989-1990.

First editions. All inscribed by Pratchett to the title pages, in 'Truckers' in black: "To Tony A child of all ages", in 'Diggers' in blue: "To Tony yet more wishes" and in 'Wings' also in blue: "To Tony Still more wishes". They are in uniform condition, firmly bound, the corners and spine ends slightly bumped, the text blocks lightly toned, 'Wings' has a slightly cocked spine. All jackets are unclipped, with minor rubbing and creasing to the edges, also slight fading to the spines. An attractive set, all nicely inscribed.




12. Pratchett, Terry. **Carpet People.**

London: Doubleday, 1992.

Revised edition, first thus. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony Extra wishes". The book is firmly bound, the boards are slightly bumped and rubbed. The text block is age toned. The dust jacket is the original and not price clipped, it is a little rubbed and creased to the edges, with slight fading to the spine.




13. Pratchett, Terry and Stephen Briggs. **The Discworld Companion.**

London: Victor Gollancz, 1994.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony Don't leave home without it...", also signed without inscription by Briggs. The book is firmly bound in somewhat marked and bumped cloth. The text block is a little sprung, it is also toned and with minor foxing appearing to the top edge. The dust jacket is not price clipped, it is slightly marked and creased with a 1 inch closed tear to the lower rear flap fold.





14. Pratchett, Terry and Stephen Briggs. **The Streets of Ankh-Morpork.**

London: Corgi Books, 1993.

First edition. Inscribed to the title page by both Briggs & Pratchett, with a nod to Frank Sinatra, Briggs has written: "Tony I've wandered each & every by-way" and Pratchett has followed up below with: "And did it my way...". The outer card covers are creased and rubbed to the edges, with minor marks. The contents are in good order, though the map is starting to show a little rubbing on the folds. Uncommon signed, particularly by both authors and in such entertaining fashion.

London: Corgi Books, 1995.

First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the title page: "To Tony" followed by a (to me) indecipherable greeting and signature. The outer card covers are slightly marked and creased. The contents and map are in good order.



First edition. Inscribed by Pratchett to the half-title page: "To Tony One last spin...". The book is firmly bound, the boards are lightly marked and bumped to the corners and edges. The text block is slightly age toned with small nicks to a couple of page edges. The dust jacket is lightly marked with creasing and some rubbing to the edges.



London: Doubleday, 2012.


First edition. Signed by Pratchett with stamp and hologram to the front endpaper. The outer card cover is slightly rubbed and creased with a knock to the lower front edge. The book itself is in good order having been protected by the card, and appears little read. The large folding map is present in the rear pocket, it is lightly creased but otherwise good.
